#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

At the December 12, 2023 Council meeting, staff were directed to report back on the costs associated with reopening the Town dock for public use for the summer of 2024. Town staff met with contractors and internal departments to create an action plan to achieve this direction.

#### **NEXT STEPS**

Site visits determined the scope of work required to reopen the dock to make it safe for the public.

<sup>\*\* -</sup> the cost of removing the tank doesn't include remediation if there is an adverse soil sample. Additional funding would be required to remediate the area.

Currently, no capital funds are in the budget to accomplish this project. Council would need to provide direction to staff and allocate the \$55,120.00 funds to complete this capital project.

If Council approves the funding, all efforts will be made to have the public dock available for public use for the summer of 2024.
