## THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF NIAGARA-ON-THE-LAKE BY-LAW NO. 2024-081

A BY-LAW TO STOP UP AND CLOSE THE ROAD ALLOWANCE DESCRIBED AS THAT PART OF THE ROAD ALLOWANCE BETWEEN TOWNSHIP LOTS 113 & 118 DESIGNATED AS PART 3 ON PLAN 30R-16322 [PIN 46385-0065(LT)]

WHEREAS, Section 9 of the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c.25, as amended, provides that a municipality has the capacity, rights, powers and privileges of a natural person for the purpose of exercising its authority under the Municipal or any other Act; and

WHEREAS, Section 28(2) of the Municipal Act, 2001, as amended, gives full jurisdiction over all road allowances to a Municipality; and

WHEREAS pursuant to the provisions of Section 34 of the Municipal Act, 2001, as amended, the Council of every municipality may pass by-laws for stopping up any highway or part thereof and selling same; and

WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Niagara-on-the-Lake deems it expedient to stop up and close the road allowance described as that Part of the Road Allowance between Township Lots 113 & 118 designated as Part 3 on Plan 30R-16322 [PIN 46385-0065(LT)];

## NOW THEREFORE, The Corporation of the Town of Niagara-on-the-Lake enacts as follows:

- 1. That the road allowance described as that Part of the Road Allowance between Township Lots 113 & 118 designated as Part 3 on Plan 30R-16322 [PIN 46385-0065(LT)] is hereby stopped up and closed.
- 2. That the Mayor and Clerk are hereby authorized to execute such authorizations, forms and other documents on behalf of the Town as may be necessary for the

- above stated purpose, including to authorize the registration of a certified copy of this by-law on title to the above-noted PIN.
- 3. That where the provisions of any other by-law are inconsistent with the provisions of this by-law, the provisions of this by-law shall prevail.
- 4. That this by-law does not take effect until it has been registered on title in the Land Registry Office.
