Newark neighbours also gets produce from the garden. Volunteer hours are also being recorded.

## Greenhouse project:

Vicky and Kevin had a meeting with the coordinator, there is a memorandum of agreement that has been sent for review. Discussion took place regarding the Greenhouse itself. Kevin will report back to the committee at the next meeting.

## Queen/Mississagua project:

Staff updated that there was a motion made at the June 21st council meeting that Council is taking the lead on the project with Mr. Kowalchuk, a thanks went out to CIB and the project is on JTC for feedback.
