Re: 16 Lucia Court- Tree Removal Application AP-2020-256

This letter is to inform you that the tree inspection held on July 27, 2020 was inconclusive. Therefore, at this time, we are unable to issue a permit for the destruction of the Dawn Redwood.

Observations taken at the time of inspection revealed a healthy Dawn Redwood tree that measured approximately 55cm at breast height.

You are advised that Section 13 of the Private Property Tree Protection By-Law states:

13.(1) If an Inspector refuses to issue a Permit, or if an Applicant objects to a condition attached to a Permit by an Inspector, the Applicant may appeal to the Committee. Such appeal shall be made by written notice received by the Inspector within seven (7) days after the date of refusal or the issuance of conditional Permit, as the case may be.

If you wish to appeal, you will need to submit a written letter by August 4, 2020.



Hi Erin,

Thanks for your quick response.

As we don't yet possess the property (we have an offer out with a condition of being able to install a pool and remove the tree in question - we have 5 days to confirm otherwise we can't buy). We don't yet have the plan/sketch of the pool including size, and since I don't know much about trees, I don't know the actual species of the tree in question.

That said, I'm attaching 2 pictures of the tree, along with a picture showing the location of the tree and where the pool would go. The pool need to respect a minimal distance of 1.5 meter from the properly line and the house. Hope this help. I'm also attaching a picture of a similar pool of what we are looking to install.

This would be our 4th inground pool and we know that having a large three like this one will damage the pool over time through the roots system, not mentioning the leafs clogging the skimmer (filtering system).

It would be ideal if we can have a phone conversation today as we'll need to make a decision on the house based on the possibility or not to remove this tree and plant several other trees (in compliance) to compensate.

My wife and I are about to make an offer to the property located at 16 Lucia Court in NOTL and one of the condition for us to purchase the property is to have confirmation that one of the large tree in the middle of the backyard <u>can</u> be removed in order for us to install a pool where the tree is located. This is a condition for us to make an offer on this property which we are planning to do today. We have 5 business days from today to confirm if the tree can be removed and we can install a pool. I have read the <u>Trees on Private Property in Urban Areas (Private Tree Protection By-law)</u> information and understand a permit will be required (at a cost) and we will have obligation to replant new trees according to the diameter of the tree to be removed, which we can comply with.

What we need at this time is a written confirmation that the tree in question can be removed for the benefit of having a pool installed.
